Pricing examples

Our pricing is based on how many colours you are printing, your paper type and trimming needs. These are examples of common print job quotes.

50 x 2 colour A3 Poster, 120gsm paper: **£40**

30 x 4 colour A3 Art Print, 190gsm paper: **£70**

100 x 1 colour A3 Poster, 120gsm paper: **£44**

250 x Business Cards, 300gsm paper: **£67**

What is Risograph printing?

Risograph printing is known for its vibrant and tactile printing results. Riso printers work by turning your black & white artwork into your chosen ink colour. The process is similar to screenprinting, in that each colour layer is printed separately and a stencil is made for each artwork layer.

Once the stencil is made, the Riso can print unlimited copies of your design. As the main cost of Riso printing is setting up the stencil, each print becomes cheaper the more you print. We can print between 1-5 colours, overlaying each new colour on the previous one.

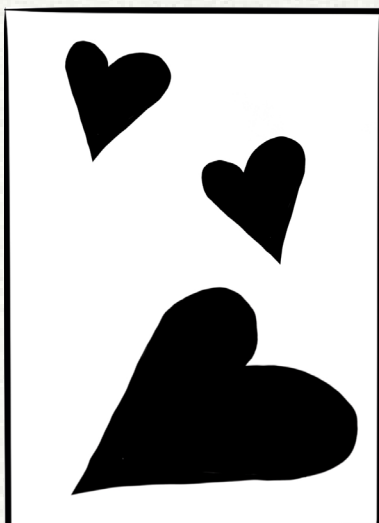
We have 11 inks to choose from. Each new colour is printed by switching the ink drums in the machine. Riso printing is very energy efficient and only uses non-toxic soy-based inks, meaning it is an eco-friendly way to print.

Riso Ink

The Riso uses non-toxic soy-based inks, giving prints a vibrant & tactile finish. Once dry, heavier areas of ink can smudge when handled. This is good to bear in mind if your artwork will be handled extensively.

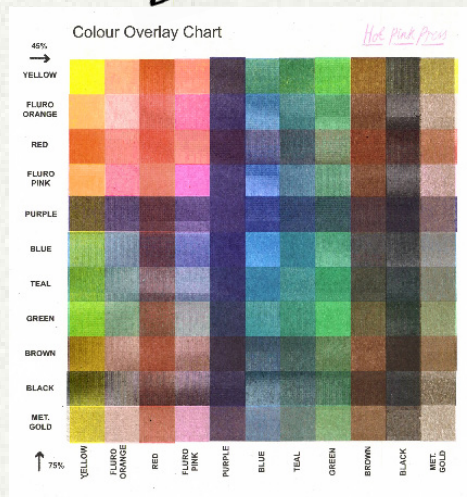
You don't need to add in any texture to your file before printing. The Riso create it's distinctive texture during printing!

Riso inks are translucent, meaning they mix when layered and take on the colour of the paper.



Paper

We hold a house stock of white & off-white recycled papers. These range from 90-300gsm. We are able to order in colour paper on request and can advise which paper weight will suit your project best.



* Metallic Gold is a speciality ink, therefore incurring an extra fee

Risograph Printing Essentials

Print Size

The largest size paper the Riso can print on is A3. As the Riso can't print full bleed, the maximum printable area is **410mm x 287mm**.



Colour layers

We can print between 1-5 colour layers for your project. Please bear in mind that the more colour layers you use makes misregistration more likely.

Paper

Our Riso can print on paper between 80-300gsm. Paper must be uncoated.

Imperfections

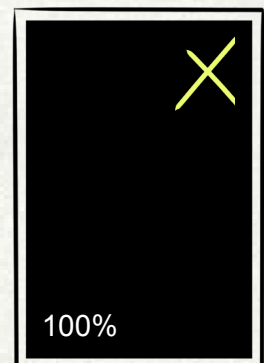
As each colour is printed separately, each layer isn't always perfectly aligned and every print varies slightly. This is called 'misregistration'. This is part of the magic of the Riso process and gives prints a unique finish. If you would like to learn how to reduce these imperfections, please see our **extended print guide**.

Ink Density

The ink can become uneven when printing large areas of solid colours. If you would like a dense area of colour we suggest dropping the opacity from 100% to 75-85% for cleaner results.



Basic File Setup

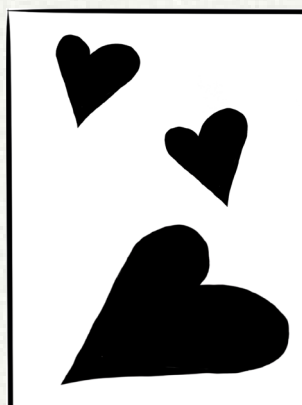
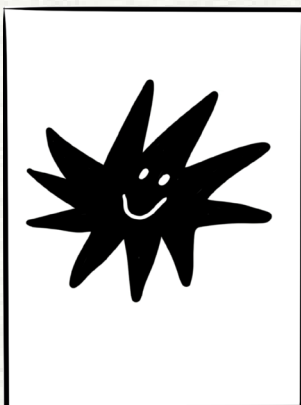
To print your artwork, we need:

1. Separate PDF files for each ink colour
2. A colour mockup of your artwork, so we know what you are hoping to achieve

Your print files should be:

1. A3 greyscale/B&W file
2. Flattened PDF which is under 10MB and 300 DPI
3. Separate file for each ink colour
4. Labelled with your name and desired colour

Recommended Software

We use Adobe Indesign, Photoshop & Illustrator to prepare our files. However, you could also use Procreate, a PDF editor or even scan in an artwork to prepare your files. The free app 'Spectrolite' is also very useful for separating colour layers.
